

BY-LAWS CHANGE

The board is proposing the following revisions to the Guild's By-Laws. These will be voted on at the April meeting.

A) To accommodate bank requirements for the changing of authorized signatories on an account the following item will be inserted as item six. The current item six will then be numbered seven.

Article III: Officers and Duties

Section 1: Officers

- 6. The past Treasurer will remain as a signing agent on the Guild checking account for the next term, in case of emergency or in the event that the current Treasurer would be unable to fulfill the Treasurer duties.
- B) Update the duties of the secretary to reflect changes in responsibilities. Addition in *italics*.

Section 2: Duties

4. The Secretary shall keep the minutes of both the Guild Board meetings and the Membership meetings. Both sets of minutes shall be presented at the next scheduled meeting of the Guild Board and of the Membership, respectively. The Secretary shall maintain the Guild records and perform duties as required.

DYE DAY 2019

Dye Day will be held in the fabulous barn of Hollie Krenz and family, 16100 Cowley Rd., Grafton 44044. We start at 9:00 am and will finish somewhere close to 2:30 pm.

Bring a lawn chair and a brown bag lunch and drink. And if you would like, bring a project, such as spinning or knitting, to work on as we wait for our pots to boil.

This year we would like to dye with 5 red dyes and use two mordants, alum & iron, which should give us 10 different colors. Our dyes will be Cochineal, Brazilwood, Madder Root, Lac and Pernambuco for red. Also planned is an Indigo vat for blues and maybe purples.

Participants will need 10 skeins, each 50 yards for the red dyes and two skeins, 50 yards each for the Indigo. Your yarn skeins can be handspun or purchased. Wool and other animal fibers work best with natural dyes.
