I want to thank everyone for their hard work in making the past season wonderful. I know that I can be a bit scatterbrain, but when we all help it comes together.



#### **DYE DAY 2019**

Date: Saturday, June 22, 9:00-about 2:30

*Place*: Hollie Krenz's barn, 16100 Cowley Rd., Grafton, 44044

Dye plan: This year we plan to dye with 5 red dyes and use two mordants, alum & iron. Our dyes will be Cochineal, Brazilwood, madder Root, Lac and Pernambuco. Using two mordants will give us two shades from each red color. We also plan to have an Indigo vat for you.

Participants should bring: 10 skeins, each 50 yards for the red dyes and 2 skeins, 50 yards each for the Indigo vat. Your yarn can be homespun or purchased. Wool or other animal fiber works best with natural dyes.

Extra's to bring: a chair, a brown bag lunch and drink, rubber gloves, plastic bags to take home your wet yarn, empty gallon milk jugs if you wish to take home any used dye at the end of the day. If you would like, bring a project, such as spinning or knitting, to work on as we wait for our pots to boil.



Come on a journey through time as we explore the history of fiber animals on every (populated) continent! We will focus on the varied breeds of sheep and how people around the world have used these fibers in clothing and art.

We will start close to the Cradle of Civilization with Karakul, move to the long wools and down breeds of the United Kingdom, on to the landraces of Scandinavia, and to the more modern breeds developed to flourish in the American West and Australia. The we'll work our way around to Asia to explore the yak and camel down we love to spin and wear! We will not forget the camelids of South America nor the continent of Africa.

At each stop we'll talk about common uses, and then try the fibers ourselves. There will be a healthy combination of unprocessed fleeces and roving, so you can do as much or as little prep work as you desire. Please bring cards and/or combs if you have them and a working spinning wheel.
