
We have room yet in the Continuous Strand Weaving Workshop and the Rare Breeds Spinning Workshop. Please see attached flyers.

MEDINA 2019-2020 CHALLENGE

The challenge for this year will be to take fiber or yarn brought in by another guild member, and make something out of it. Your final project can be spun, knitted, crocheted, woven, felted or anything you can imagine. For fun, take a picture of what you are starting with. You then present the finished item at our April 2020 meeting. You may choose to keep the finished item, give it back to your donor, or there is also the option to donate it for our May raffle.

To participate, select 4 to 6 ounces of unspun fiber (any form) or one full skein of yarn. Put it inside a paper bag along with your name, and mark it just "Fiber" or "Yarn" on the outside of the bag, and seal the bag. Bring it to our September meeting. Members will then choose a bag (content unseen) to use to complete their challenge project.

Great way to broaden your horizons, and have fun doing it.

OCTOBER SPINNING AT STAN HYWET


AUSTRALIAN CHALLENGE
