

DYE DAY 2021 Saturday, September 25 Yellow to Green—Let's try again.

We are planning to have our annual Dye Day on Saturday, September 25.

We will be dyeing with four yellow dyes, Marigold flowers, Goldenrod, Yellow Onion skins and Osage Orange. After dyeing 2 skeins in each dye pot, you will be top-dyeing one of the skeins in Indigo for green. Your skeins can be handspun or purchased. Wool or other animal fiber works best with the natural dyes. Each skein should measure 50 yards in length and tied beginning to end. Three figure-eight ties in white or natural cotton or wool should secure your skein. Bring 8 skeins for the yellow to green project and 2 extra skeins to dip in Indigo for blue.

Dye Day will be hosted by Hollie Krenz, in her family barn in Grafton.(16100 Cowley Rd, Grafton, 44044).

Later this summer we will ask you to sign up to participate so we can plan for supplies.

Dye Day Dye Stuff / Help Us Collect

Help us fill our dye pots with marigolds, onion skins and Goldenrod for Dye Day.

- Grow marigolds this summer and pick the flower heads and freeze for us.
- Save the outer yellow skin of onions when cooking.
- And watch the fields for harvesting goldenrod the first of August. The flower heads can be frozen until Dye Day.

BOOK REVIEW: THREAD MAGIC by Lotte Dalgaard and Paulette Adam

If you are a weaver who also spins, you are going to love the newest addition to the Medina Guild library. Thread Magic is a unique and wellwritten book that will open your eyes to textures and structures you never thought possible.

Lotte Dalgaard is a well-known Danish weaver noted for using weave structures to create threedimensional fabrics through the use of active and passive threads. Her collaborator Paulette Adam is an expert in yarns and unusual materials.

Active yarns – those twisted beyond the usual level, elastic threads and threads that shrink—are used in weaving to create structural fabrics for everything from shawls and scarves to t-shirts and coats. The authors illustrate how raised lines as well as folds and spirals can be woven into a fabric, how three-dimensional structures are created and how perfectly ordinary threads can essentially be made to react in almost magical ways by combining them with "active" yarns.

The reason this book is more suited to the adventurous spinner is that the weaving yarns highlighted in the book are very hard to find in North America. Most of the resources at the end of the book are European vendors. The only American vendor I have found to carry active (over-twisted) yarns is Lunatic Fringe, which has just released a line of crepe silks and linens in both s and z twists. They, and Lone Star Loom Room, also carry elastic yarns.

This book is a deep dive into active yarns, how they are combined with other fibers, how they react after washing, and how to handle unruly yarns when weaving. Although I wasn't a huge fan of their fashion choices, the book gave me many inspirational ideas to take to the loom.

I would highly recommend that you borrow this book from our library.
