

We sell per ounce because the wool of our sheep is a bit different; it has a dual coat, and the two fibers are a pretty similar length. This makes it work a little bit different from typical wool, and so we recommend getting smaller amounts, just to get a feel for it.

The wool is very strong, and makes great rugs, mats, and outdoor garments that get a lot of use, and can also make nice sweaters. It takes to the felting process very well, but it will also resist spontaneous felting if a fleece is used for lining in a garment, due to the second set of fibers.
