

Magic in the Water: Wet Finishing Handwovens by Laura Fry

A 3-ring binder with information for handweavers on how to wet finish their cloth. There are samples of various handwoven cloth made from a variety of fibers such as wool, cotton, cottolin, silk, Tencel, linen etc.

Keep Me Warm One Night: Early Handweaving in Eastern Canada by Harrold B. Burnham and Dorothy K. Burnham

This book describes the traditional tools and equipment used by regional weavers and catalogs numerous examples of early Canadian Settlement patterns.
